Leadership Transition at Lake Bluff Public Library

The Lake Bluff Public Library has entered a leadership transition following the departure of Library Director Natalie Starosta, who accepted the position of Library Director at Huntley Area Public Library.

During her tenure, she worked with Library staff and the Board of Trustees to strengthen Library operations, advance long-term planning, and support key initiatives. Natalie's work included developing a new five-year Strategic Plan, creating a Capital Facility Plan, expanding the Library of Things collection, securing funding for the Library's asbestos abatement project, and strengthening community partnerships.

The Lake Bluff Public Library Board of Trustees appointed David Seleb as Interim Library Director at its July 21, 2026, meeting. He previously served in the same role from September 2024 through March 2025 and will lead the Library while the Board conducts a search for the next Library Director.

The Board of Trustees extends its sincere appreciation to Natalie for her leadership and dedication to the Lake Bluff community and wishes her continued success as Library Director at Huntley Area Public Library.

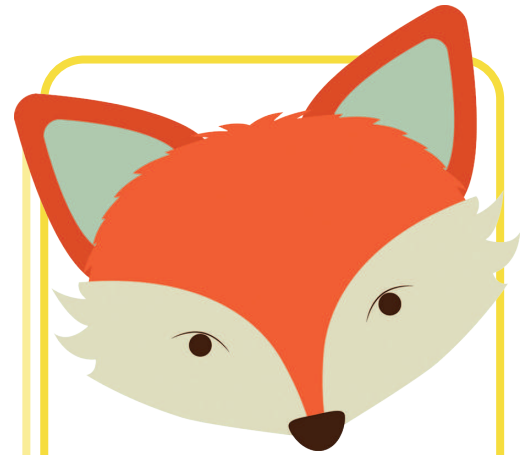
